**Membership Statistics**

- 70+ membership down

#### **Coastal Committee Report**

  - Lunenburg will be advertising for another coastal tour July 30, 31, Aug 1

### **High Performance Report (Tracy Stuart)**

- Took our NSPPI highlights of that
- Recently had 7 athletes named to Team Canada (goal was 3)
- Representation at CanAmMex, U23 World, World Rowing Games, PanAm Games
- National Rowing Championships (4 medals Emerson Crick, Emily Munroe, Claire Ellison, Melanie Elfenstein)
  - Particular shout out to Emerson Crick for his success
- Talent Identification some conflict with the ringette season
- Emily Munroe was a TID athlete performing very well
- Coaches Impacting Excellence Programs long list of coaches (albeit only men)

# Treasurer's Report (Warren Laybolt)

- Regatta revenue continues to be the largest source of non-government revenue
- First year of additional excellence funding
- Successfully hired and onboarded a Technical Director (Rob)
- Purchased two new singles for the Provincial Team
- Rowing Canada has announced they will be increasing dues and fees by ~4%
  - Row NS may adjust seat fees to maintain flat \$ amount for ease of regatta administration
- Overall, small cash flow gain
- Draft 2023 financials are posted on the website just need to confirm with the Sport NS bookkeeper
- 2023 was generally pretty similar to 2022 review of 2023 provided by Warren
- Building from that, budget 2024 is substantially the same as 2023

# **Budget 2024 Review (Warren Laybolt)**

- We will post a version online note that budget does not currently include anything with respect to hosting beach sprints
- For now does not include Canada Games, but need to look to do that again in the future, but not something we've considered for 2024 just yet
- Have a draft multi-year budget looking to project expenses for 4 years
